Pat,

I'm sorry, I got sidetracked. Here's my bio.

Special Agent Scott Savedow's law enforcement career began more than fourteen years ago with the U.S. Border Patrol in California. After the tragic events of September 11, 2001, he began working with the Federal Aviation Administration and later the Transportation Security Administration as a Federal Air Marshal.

For more than ten years, SA Savedow has worked with the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development, Office of Inspector General's Miami Field Office. In this position, he has developed and implemented several innovative practices to combat fraud and criminal activity within low income housing communities.

The most recognized of these was the Government Housing Operations Special Taskforce of Palm Beach County which fostered communication between Federal, state, and local housing and law enforcement agencies. It also established a joint investigative team focused on investigating and prosecuting crime and coordinating subsidized housing eviction and program termination efforts. From 2009 to 2012, the GHOST initiative has led to more than 200 arrests and convictions involving losses of \$2,872,338 and to date, courts have ordered restitution of \$1,781,025 to HUD and local housing agencies. These efforts have significantly reduced the crime rates, improving the quality of life in low income communities.

And here is a program description.

I will be presenting an Introduction to Fraud within Government Housing Programs. This course will provide attendees with an understanding of the basic program rules and common fraud schemes within the Public Housing, Housing Choice Voucher (Section 8), and other low income housing programs. They will also learn red flags or warning factors that public assistance fraud may be occurring, and what state and federal criminal statutes apply to such activities.
