Bio Brief

Michael Wright was born in Jacksonville Beach, FL and grew up in Berkeley County, SC. His family has roots in Broward County (Pompano Beach) dating to the 1930's on his mother's side and the 1940's (North Miami) on his fathers'. He moved to South Florida in 1986 and worked in the financial/banking industry. In the early 1990's, he determined to pursue his dream of becoming a public servant. As a result, Michael is an Honors Alumni of Broward Community College (AA 96), as well as Florida Atlantic University (BPM 99 and MPA 2007).

His public sector service includes an Intern position with Broward County Community Development and as a Planner with Palm Beach County Community Development with a focus towards Economic Development and CDBG activities. He has been employed by Broward County since November 2001, initially as a Contract Administrator with the Homeless Initiative Partnership (HIP) Administration focusing on County and State funded services. In 2006 he was promoted Administrative Manager responsible for Requests For Proposal (RFPs) and Emergency Management Services (EMS) grants with the Human Services Department and Health Care Services Section. He was promoted to Administrator of the Homeless Initiative Partnership in July 2010 and is overseeing the County's Homeless Continuum of Care.

Michael has received numerous awards exemplifying his commitment to teamwork, performance and was recognized with an Award of Excellence by the Human Services Department in 2005 for his contributions to Hurricane Wilma relief efforts. He is a graduate of Leadership Broward Class XXII, and the Broward County Emerging Leaders Program (2009) and currently serves as a Leadership Mentor.

Michael's volunteer/civic/professional affiliations includes having served, or currently serving, as a Board Member of the Florida Coalition for the Homeless; a member of two (2) local non-profit organization Boards whose mission is serving those in recovery from substance abuse and currently as Vice-Chair of the County's Ten-Year to End Homelessness Committee. He is also a past appointee to the City of Wilton Manors Community Advisory Board, Board of Adjustment and currently is an appointee to the City's Planning and Zoning Board.
